Rationale behind denial of office space to the G.S.U.

1. The 1973 Board of Visitors' decision on the G.S.U. states, in part, that:

"The Constitution of the G.S.U. and its statement of purposes are sufficiently broad to include engaging in propaganda and political activity to change legislation."

2. In a December 1975 decision, the Student Activities Committee ruled that the activities of the G.S.U. have not "changed substantially" since the Board of Visitors' Ruling of 1973.
3. President Hereford reaffirmed the decision of the SAC in the most recent ruling on the subject.
4. The G.S.U. has not changed its stated purpose since the most recent decision.
